

Envelopes for these are in the front of your packets. Remember what these ministries are about. Bethesda Home is a ministry to care for those with learning disabilities. Lutheran Heritage Foundation prints and gives materials to our foreign missionaries. Lutheran Hour is a radio ministry that broadcasts the Gospel around the world. Lutheran World Relief takes food and resources to disaster areas around the world.

In August we received \$46.40 for the Garage/Maintenance Building. We now have \$16,603.50 in this fund. Please continue to give to it. We still have a long way to go to pay for this building. Simply mark your gift "Garage".

So far 81 members have given \$9,675.18 for our "\$118 In '018" offering. These gifts will go into Dream Fund III and will be used for new facilities. Dream Fund III now has given-assets of \$120,737.30. If you have not used your pink envelope we are praying and hoping you will use it next Sunday.

We are also praying for School Sponsors. We need 40. As of this writing we now have fifteen (15). Remember, a School Sponsor gives a gift of \$200 (all at once or over a period of months) to help a child attend Trinity School.

I read this quote recently. Sad to say, it is probably truer than we would like to think.. "Many people give a tenth to the Lord – a tenth of what they ought to give."

TRINITY LUTHERAN SCHOOL ENDOWMENT FUND

It is our DREAM that Trinity Lutheran School be one of the finest schools in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, that our program of Christian and academic education be second to none, that our teachers and support people be among the best-paid, and that our facilities, equipment, and materials be of top quality. To fulfill this DREAM the Trinity Lutheran School Endowment Fund was established in 1969. Already it is a tremendous blessing to Trinity Lutheran School. Income from it is being used for teacher's salaries, and has been used for education for the faculty, classroom remodeling, equipment, materials, program development, books, desks, etc.

Since January 2018, the School Endowment Fund has received \$53,508.13 in gifts, memorials, bequests, and farm income. This amount brings the given-assets of this fund to \$1,487,803.04. In 2017, dividend and interest income was \$145,923.11. This income went into the Home Budget to help pay teacher salaries. Last year desks were purchased with this income and this year chairs were purchased.

Memorials have been: Albert Witte-\$425.00; Janice Smith-\$565.00; Sandy Haeffele-\$945.00; Frances Reisenbickler-\$50.00.

Bequests received were \$1,000 from Janice Smith, and \$1,30.97 from Ed Sowers. Farm income received was \$36,000. Received also was \$3.00 from Scrip and \$20.00 from Thrivent Choice. Many members gave gifts in the envelope that is in our packet.

This fund is of tremendous blessing to our Trinity School. Please continue to remember it with gifts, memorials and bequests. Every child at Trinity School is blessed through this fund

HEALTH NOTE FOR SEPTEMBER

September is fall prevention awareness month and specifically, the first week of Fall, September 22 to September 28, is fall prevention week. The following is reprinted from the Fall Prevention Center of Excellence and provides a brief list of modifications you can make to help prevent falls wherever you live. If you have access to the internet the website is www.stopfalls.org and has a lot more information on topics such as: use of assistive devices, preventing outdoor falls, medication awareness, vision and falls, talking with your doctor about fall prevention, and preventing falls with pets. Another good resource is the National Council of Aging; website is www.ncoa.org. One easy thing to do is help reduce the risk of falls is to slow down.

Home Modification: Making Your Home Safer

How you decorate your home reflects your personality and sense of style. In addition to making you feel comfortable, the things in your home can increase your safety or make it more likely that you could fall.

Making changes to your home — also known as home modifications — can make activities easier, improve your health and wellness, and reduce your chances of falling. These changes can include removing hazards, adding supports such as handrails, or changing how or where you do activities. Below are some suggestions to make your home safer.

- 1. **Keep pathways clear**: Keep stairs and walkways clear by removing objects that you could trip over. Add storage for things that are usually on the floor, such as shoes or papers.
- 2. Be aware of uneven surfaces: Look out for changes in the level of flooring, such as in doorways or in between carpeting and tile. Remove throw rugs or use gripper underneath to secure them to the floor. If you can move a rug easily with your foot, you could slip on it.
- 3. **Keep frequently used items close by**: Reaching up high or bending down low can cause you to lose balance.

For example – in the kitchen, make sure that cooking supplies and other items that you use often are easy to reach.

- 4. **Light your way**: Install bright lights, have switches at both ends of stairways, and use night lights to light the path from your bedroom to bathroom. Light switches that glow are easier to see in the dark.
- 5. Add support in the bathroom: Bathrooms can be dangerous, especially when things are wet. Put grab bars near the toilet and in the shower. Non-skid strips in the bathtub can keep you from slipping.
- 6. Stay safe on the stairs: Consider installing handrails on both sides of the stairs. If you already have handrails, be sure you use them. Check that they are properly installed and not loose.

As your abilities change over the years, your home should provide you and your loved ones with the support you need to do daily activities and the things that you enjoy.


