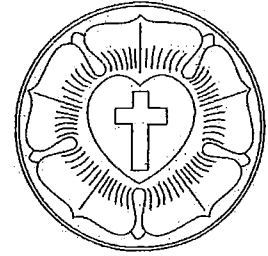

LUTHER AND THE SACRAMENT

The following two paragraphs about the Sacrament (Holy Communion) are taken from Luther's "PREFACE TO THE SMALL CATECHISM".

"When someone does not seek or desire the Sacrament at least four times a year, it is to be feared that he despises the Sacrament and is not a Christian, just as a person is not a Christian who does not believe or hear the Gospel." For Christ did not say, "Leave this out, or, despise this," but, "do this, as often as you drink it" (1 Corinthians 11:25), and other such words. Truly, He wants it done, and note entirely neglected and despised. "Do this" he says.

Now, whoever does not highly value the Sacrament shows that he has no sin, no flesh, no devil, no world, no death, no danger, no hell. In other words, he does not

believe any such things, although he is in them up over his head and his ears and is doubly the devil's own. On the other hand, he needs no grace, no life, no paradise, no heaven, no Christ, no God, nor anything good. For if he believed that he had so much evil around him, and needed so much that is good, he would not neglect the Sacrament, by which such evil is remedied and so much good is bestowed. Nor would it be necessary to force him to go to the Sacrament by any law. He would come running and racing of his own will, would force himself, and beg that you must give him the Sacrament.

A QUOTE ABOUT WORSHIP

"When the Word of God is spoken, the people of God are led in prayer and praise. The sacraments are received, God works in a powerful way. This is our arena where we behold the glory of God. The Triune God welcomes, promises, admonishes, and comforts us in communal worship, giving us a taste of our true life in Christ, as we call out 'Abba, Father' through his Spirit. Worship is a theological space. The worship service might be unglamorous, but God has promised to be present, where he meets and nourishes his people, including the pastor-theologian. It is through worship that God shapes and forms his body deeper into the image of Christ.

In the words of the Apostle Paul, 'I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses all knowledge – that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of Christ.' (Eph. 3:17-19)."

Our financial picture continues to look good. However, we did lose ground in September. At the end of 9 months we are BEHIND \$10,900.55 in the HOME budget, BEHIND \$3,566.27 in the MISSION budget, and \$139.21 BEHIND in the BUILDING budget. To be BEHIND in all three areas of our budget is unusual. Let's pray that during October we will be able to do some catching up. The third-quarter stewardship reports will be in the Nartex on October 21st. Be sure to stop and pick up your report.

We are getting close to making our goals for the Lutheran Heritage Foundation and Lutheran Hour. Maybe, in October. I've read that Lutheran World Relief is now helping North Carolina and Indonesia.

In September we received \$150.00 for the Garage/Maintenance Building. We now have \$16,753.50 in this fund. October 28th is going to be "Garage Sunday". On that Sunday we are going to have a special offering for this project. We are praying that all our members will participate and that we will raise all or almost all needed to fund this project.

91-member families gave for this year's "\$118 in '018" offering. Total amount received was \$10,305.36. This will go into Dream Fund III and be added to the \$120,737.30 we already have. Thank you to all who gave for this, this year.

We are also praying for School Sponsors. We need 40. As of this writing we now have twenty-three (23). Please be one of the 17 we still need. Remember, a School Sponsor gives a gift of \$200.00 (all at once or over a period of 9 months) to help a child attend Trinity School.

Our Finance Committee is working on our 2019 budget. We are looking to raise our base salary from \$25,800 to 26,800, an increase of \$1,000. We consider this a must.

TECHNOLOGY ENDOWMENT FUND

Since March 1st the Technology Endowment Fund has received \$2,775.86, in gifts, memorials and a bequest. With these blessings the fund now has given-assets of \$111,177.06. In 2017 the income from the invested

assets of this fund has \$4,385.57. This amount plus the income received this year is being saved to pay for replacing our school/church telephone system.

Memorials received were \$85.00 in memory of Carol Pierce and \$500.00 in memory of Roger Nelson. A bequest of \$1,030.97 was received from the estate of Ed Sowers. Gifts through the Scrip Program were \$79.36.

This fund is tremendously important to our church and school. The cost of technology grows every year. The income from this fund will help us meet these costs. In the front of your packets there is a Technology Endowment Fund (Future Needs) envelope (yellow border). If you have not used this envelope, please do so soon.

A GLIMPSE OF TRINITY'S HISTORY

Pastor Conrad Vetter was pastor of Trinity from 1883 until his death June 6, 1907. He was born on March 28, 1835 in Ebsdorf, Kurhessen, near Marburg. Educated in Marburg, he taught from 1862 to 1865 in a school for troubled boys in Schladen, Hannover. Desiring to serve the Lord, he turned to the training school of Pastor Louis Harms in Hermannsburg. In 1866 he emigrated to the U.S. and entered the practical department of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, completing his studies in December 1867. He served parishes in Warrenton, Missouri, Calhoun County Illinois, Osage Bluff, Missouri. While here in Atchison, he served as a circuit visitor, member of the district mission commission, chair of the commission on support and of the Eastern Kansas Pastoral Conference. During his pastorate Trinity moved from 10th and Commercial to 8th and Laramie, built a school (the yellow building today), a church (burned in 1943 and a parsonage (where the South mobile is), razed in 1963.

PASTOR'S ADULT BIBLE CLASS

During July and August, we have been studying "Biblical Husbands and Wives". We have looked at why they are in the Bible, how God was a part of their lives, what part they played in the plan of salvation. We have looked at Ananias and Sapphira, Aquila and Priscilla, Zacharias and Elizabeth, Joseph and Mary, Adam and Eve, Abraham and Sarah, Lot and his wife, Isaac and Rebekah. God has a word for us in the stories of these couples.

On September 16th, and since we have since we have listed to Jack Selberg (past director of Valley

Hope) speak on the "Family Dynamics of Addiction", how alcohol or drug addiction in one member of the family takes its toll on the whole family. His lectures have been GREAT. I have heard all kinds of good comments. Those

TEC21 is available to Lutheran school educators around the country. Congrats to Lori for representing Trinity in her role as TEC21 facilitator!

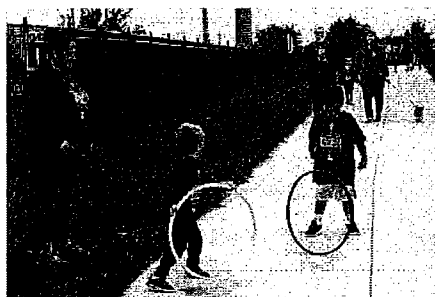
TRINITY FUN RUN!

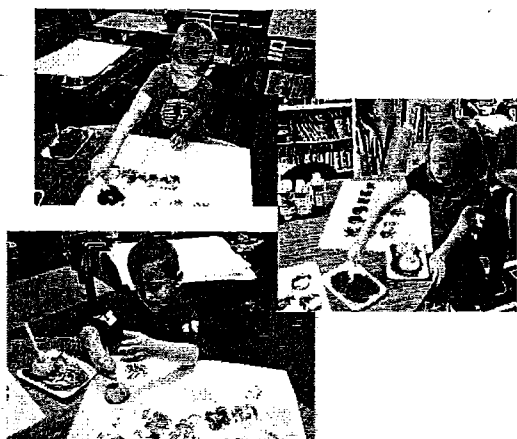

Health Note October 2018

October is, among other things, breast cancer awareness month. The following basic information on breast cancer and mammograms is taken from healthfinders.org and WebMD websites. I know it is not a comfortable topic to think about, but it is important information. Remember, even though it is very rare, men can also get breast cancer.



Breast cancer is the second most common cancer in women. About 1 in 8 women born today in the United States will get breast cancer sometime during her life. The good news is that mammograms can help find breast cancer early. Most women can survive breast cancer if it's found and treated early. Women ages 40-49 should talk to their healthcare provider about when to start getting mammograms and how often to get them based on risk factors such as family history. Women ages 50-74 should get a mammograms every 2 years; again, unless advised to get one more often because of risk factors.

Mammograms can be used to screen for breast cancer in women who have no signs or symptoms or to diagnose women with symptoms like lumps in their breasts. When you get a mammogram, a technician will place your breast between 2 plastic plates and press your breast flat to get a clear picture. Getting a mammogram can be uncomfortable for some women, but the discomfort only lasts a few seconds. It takes about 20 minutes to get mammograms.

Breast cancer is cancer that forms in the breast when abnormal cells turn into cancer. Breast cancer can spread to other parts of the body. Talk to your healthcare provider if notice any of these changes:

- a lump or an area that feels very firm in the breast or armpit
- a change in size, shape, or feel of the breast
- fluid (called discharge) coming out of a nipple
- skin on the breast that is itchy, red, flaky, or dimpled

If a lump is found the physician may take a small bit of tissue from the lump for testing. This is called a biopsy.

Most health insurance will cover the cost of a mammogram when ordered by your health care provider. If you don't have health insurance I urge to go to the Atchison Community Health Clinic for assistance in getting a mammogram. Take action against breast cancer.

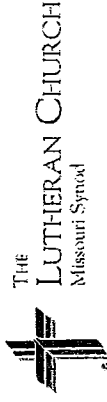
