EVANGELISM COMMITTEE



ST. PAUL LUTHERAN HIGH SCHOOL COMING TO TRINITY ON FEBRUARY 7TH:

The Chamber Choir and the String Orchestra of Saint Paul Lutheran High School will be presenting a concert at Trinity Lutheran Church in Atchison, Kansas, on Thursday, February 7 at 7:00pm, as part of their 2019 Midwest tour. The concert will feature the Saint Paul String Orchestra playing some classic Baroque pieces, as well as some excerpts from "Carnival of the Animals" by Camille Saint-Saëns, and two movements of Edvard Grieg's "Peer Gynt Suite."

The Chamber Choir, an elite group of the top 15 singers selected from the school's 60-voice concert choir, will perform the second half of the concert. The concert will be conducted by the Saint Paul Music Director, Dr. Jerrode Baker Marsh.

The touring ensembles will also present a workshop/assembly at Trinity Lutheran School at 1pm on Thurs-day afternoon. The students will have the chance to hear some of the works the choir and orchestra will perform that night and will even get to participate in some songs with the choir. They will also see some demonstrations of stringed instrument techniques and get to hear from the high school students about what it is like going to a boarding school. Students who participate in the assembly will have the opportunity to participate in the evening's concert.
