**GARAGE/MAINTENANCE BUILDING**

Last month we reported that the dirt work had been done for the Garage/Maintenance Building. Because of the rain, not much has been done in the last month.

Some posts have been put into place. Concrete is next when we have some dry days.

We have now borrowed \$50,000 from the Lutheran Church Extension Fund to finish paying for the Garage/Maintenance Building. The loan is for 10 years. Payments will be \$468.51 per month. Interest for the first two years will be 2.5% after that, the going rate. We hope to pay for it in the couple of years. We had around \$45,000 to begin with. If you wish to make special gifts to pay down the debt, simply mark them "Garage Payment".

### **WINDOW COVERINGS**

The window coverings are now in place and what a difference they make. The work was done by Kearney Construction and the final total cost was \$29,486.50. This was paid out of the Sunday offerings you give on the line Building Fund.

### **MEMBERSHIP**

On May 19<sup>th</sup>, eight youth and six adults became communicant members of Trinity through the Rite of Confirmation. After confessing their faith, the confirmands were asked, "Do you desire to be a member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church and of this congregation?" To which each answer "I do". Then the confirmands were asked, "Do you also, as a member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, intend to continue steadfast in the confession of this church, and suffer all even death, rather than fall away from it?" To which each answered, "I do so intend with the help of God." And then came this, "Finally,

do you intend faithfully to conform all your life to the rule of the divine Word, to be diligent in the use of the means of grace, to walk as it becometh the Gospel of Christ, and in faith, word, and deed to remain true to the Triune God, even unto death?" To which all answered, "I do so intend, by the grace of God."

All of us who are communicant members of Trinity have confessed our faith in the Triune God and then answered these questions with the answers above. We have vowed that with the help of God and the grace of God we are going to be faithful in obedience to our Lord's Word, faithful in worship and receiving the Lord's Supper, faithful in serving and giving discipleship.

These questions are questions of big commitment filled with expectation. In becoming members, we committed ourselves to growing as Christians, followers of Jesus Christ, disciples under His Lordship. We committed ourselves to, as said above, worshiping together, serving alongside each other, carrying out the ministry of our Lord through our church, fulfilling the mission he has given us.

So, in view of all this, what does membership at Trinity today mean? On an average Sunday we have 30-34% of our members in worship, which means that while 368 members are here to worship, 840 are not. We have 901 communicant members but 425 of these have not been to Holy Communion this year. What is also worrisome is that those who are not coming to worship and Holy Communion are not serving or giving, are not in the Word, and even if they are praying, they are not being heard (Psalm 66:18), they are not growing in faith.

We have names on our membership list who have not been here to worship or receive Holy Communion for years, not even on Christmas or Easter. What is painful is that I know each and all. I have taught them in Trinity School, Wednesday School, Inquirer's Class. I have baptized and confirmed most. I have visited, called, sent cards, sent bulletins, prayed. I have married them and buried their relatives and friends. Elders have visited, fellow members have exhorted. What is so sad about this is that folks are not worshipping, hearing the Word and receiving the Lord's Supper, are dying spiritually. Their salvation is in jeopardy.

So, it is time to once again say these are the expectations of membership, to ask the question, "Why would you want to belong to a church if you are not going to worship in that church? On the night before He died, Jesus, in the Upper Room, said this to His disciples, "If anyone loves me, he will obey my teachings...He who does not love me will not obey my teachings". Worship is thankful obedience which flows out of our love for our Lord. More on the meaning of membership later. In the meantime, I pray to see you in worship and at the Lord's Table.

We have now reached and gone beyond our Lutheran Hour goal. That's good. Thank you to all who have given to this important ministry. Please use the other benevolence envelopes in the front of your packet so that we can make the other goals which are listed above.

So far this year we have received \$711.00 for our Vacation Bible School ministry. VBS costs about \$2,000 to do. Please use this envelope which is in the front of your packet.

We have borrowed \$50,000 from the Lutheran Church Extension Fund to finish paying for the Garage/Maintenance building. Our scheduled monthly payment on this debt will be \$468.51. The loan is a 10-year loan. This payment will come out of the Sunday Building Fund giving.

Please keep in mind our special Dream Fund III offering the last Sunday of July. This year it will be "\$119 in '019".

The cost of the covering for our church's stained-glass windows was \$29,486.50. This was paid out of the Sunday morning Building Fund giving. This summer the yellow school building will be painted. Cost will be around \$3,800. This will be paid for by Buildings and Grounds Foundation income.

Please pray for our financial picture, that all of our members will be faithful in their giving for the Lord's work here at Trinity. And, here is a quote to read and think about. "God directs us to give regularly and generously (I Corinthians 16:2). You may never be in a better position to give generously than you are today. The decision to give God your first and best is usually not made with calculators or with pencil and paper. The decision to give to God the first portion of your paycheck is made on your knees and with your heart. Giving generously and cheerfully has very little to do with mathematical formulas."

### **SCHOOL GRANT FUND**

May was a good month for the School Grant Fund. We received \$1,134.00 in gifts. The offering from the Circus was \$761.00 and the offering from the Eighth-Grade graduation was \$343.00. Both of these offering went to the School Grant Fund.

This fund now has given-assets of \$371,567.60. Last year we received \$16,928.08 in dividend and interest income from this invested amount, all of which went in tuition grants to students at Trinity School. Thirty-eight students received this help. Since we are raising tuition \$100 for next year, we will need more income from this fund. So, please remember the School Grant Fund with you gifts, memorials, and bequests. The envelope is in the front of your packet.

### **TECHNOLOGY ENDOWMENT FUND**

May was also a good month for our Technology Endowment Fund. We received \$372.30 in gifts. This fund now has given-assets of \$114,294.46. Income last year from this invested amount was \$5,435.21. For the last couple of years, we have saved the income from this fund so that now it is being used to pay for the new telephone system that Jeremy Blanton is installing in the church and school. ## Health Note for June 2019: Skin Cancer

As we enter with summer months most of us will likely be spending more time outside. The following article is a good reminder to all of us to remember to protect ourselves from harmful UV rays when outdoors.

There are some interesting statistics regarding skin cancer that are not all that well known. Skin cancer is the most common type of cancer in the United States. There are more than 3.5 million cases of skin cancer diagnosed annually. This is more than the total of breast, prostate, lung and colon cancers combined. One in five Americans will develop skin cancer in their lifetime. Because many skin cancers are caused from sun exposure, there is worldwide distribution of skin cancer. However lighter-skinned people are most prone to develop skin cancers. The ultra-violet (UV) rays of the sun and from tanning beds can destroy DNA, and the skin cannot always repair itself.

There are three most common types of skin cancer: basal cell carcinoma (BCC), squamous cell carcinoma (SCC), and Melanoma. Basal cell carcinoma is the most common type. This type usually will show up on the head, neck and back of hands—areas of greatest sun exposure. However, it can also show up on the trunk, arms and legs. It grows slowly but can grow wide and deep destroying skin tissue and bone. Those with greatest risk of BCC have fair-skin with light hair and blue or gray eyes. Also, those who spend a lot of time outdoors without sunscreen or protective clothing, who are on immune system suppressing medications, and long-term or over exposure to X-rays are susceptible to developing skin cancer.

Squamous cell carcinoma is the most common type of skin cancer in fair-skinned people, but people of all skin types can get SCC. The same people as above can get SCC, but additional predispositions include exposure to cancer-causing chemicals, have previously seriously burned skin, sores or ulcers on the skin, and those who spend large amounts of time near heat sources.

Melanoma is the most serious form of skin cancer. It begins in the pigment-producing cells without warning or it can begin in a mole. One American dies every hour from melanoma. Risk factors include being Caucasian, having biological relatives with melanoma, having more than 50 large or unusual moles and previous skin cancers. The **ABCDE Rule** for recognizing melanoma is **A**symmetry, **B**order irregularity, **C**olor (most often tan, brown or black, but also red, white or blue), **D**iameter (often larger than 6 millimeters), and **E**volving (a change in size, shape, color, or a “different” look). Individuals who are seriously sunburned as children have double the chance of developing melanoma.

Prevention of skin cancers cannot be complete, but protection can be implemented. The generous use of sunscreen with SPF 30 or more and being water resistant is of great help. This should be used on cloudy and hazy days as well as bright sunny days since the UV rays are still present. Protective clothing (long sleeves, long pants, hats), umbrellas, sunglasses and staying in the shade will prevent strong exposure to the damaging rays of the sun. Because Vitamin D requires sunlight for synthesis, taking additional Vitamin D is considered good practice.

## Frequently Asked Questions

### 1. What makes Trinity different?

We believe in helping every student grow academically, in character, and in faith. We excitedly proclaim salvation in Jesus Christ in all that we do. Our approach to education and classroom management is motivated by the understanding that every student is a unique child of God and loved by Him. Our teachers work to help the students live moral lives that value themselves and others. We also want our children to experience the wonders of His creation and have regular opportunities for enrichment with field trips and other extra-curricular activities.

### 2. What are the class sizes?

The average class size is 10-15 students. Our teachers K-8 hold a KS teaching license and participate in continuing education to improve their knowledge and skills.

### 3. What is the cost to send my child(ren)?

Trinity offers Preschool for children ages 3 and 4. The cost for the PK3 program is \$650 (\$65 per month) for the year. The cost for the PK4 program is \$850 (\$85 per month) for the full year. PK programs require a \$50 enrollment fee. Registration begins in March. K-8 Tuition:

Grant and Aid: Tuition assistance is available to families. There is a \$35 non-reimbursable application fee. For more information refer to the Parent Handbook or contact our office.

Our school utilizes a tuition management system called FACTS. Navigate to the school website at [www.tlsks.org](http://www.tlsks.org) and go to the Admissions tab for information, including Financial Aid.

**4. Is Trinity a KS accredited school?** Yes. Trinity participates in the KS State Assessments.

### 5. What is the curriculum?

Our curriculum is based on the KS College and Career Standards. Our religion curriculum is through One in Christ. We integrate technology in our instruction and assessment and use data to focus on student strengths and needs.

### 6. Does Trinity have extra-curricular opportunities?

Yes. Students have opportunity to participate in Athletics (grades 4-8 depending on sport) and Academic Competitions with other Lutheran Schools. We also participate in the Gathering of the Talents through Concordia University.

### 7. Can my child attend if they are not of the Lutheran faith?

Of course! We are here to serve all students and families in the community who desire a quality Christian education. We have many students from different congregations.

### 8. If my child has special needs, is Trinity able to provide services?

Trinity receives support through Atchison Public Schools (USD 409) Special Education services for students who are on IEPs. Services such as speech, PT, and OT are administered on site. Trinity also receives Title I services through USD 409 where students are identified for additional help in math and reading. Those services are provided on site.

### 9. How do students get to and from school?

Families are responsible for getting their children to and from school. Carpooling is encouraged. We do not provide bus transportation.

Trinity has a standardized dress code. We believe standardized dress improves academic focus and helps create an orderly educational environment for our students.

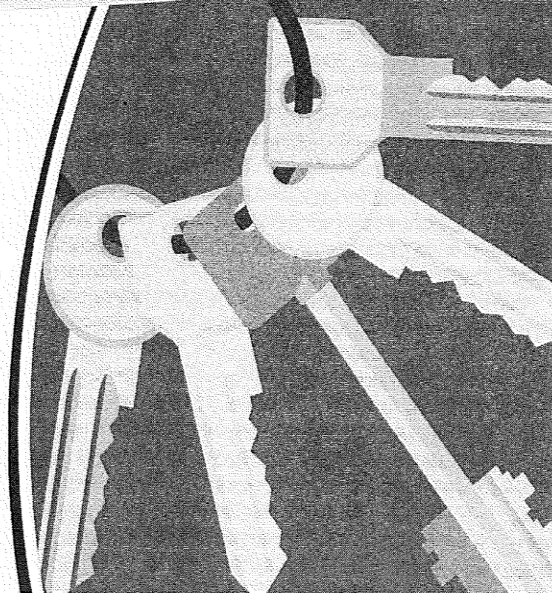

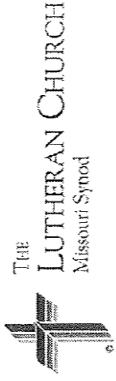
