Our Financial Picture is much better then it was at the beginning of November. That is because of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Mile Offering which we had on November 3<sup>rd</sup> and folks have given since. So, at the end of November in the HOME budget we are BEHIND \$35,708.59, in the MISSION budget BEHIND \$8,308.18 and in the BUILDING budget AHEAD \$2,595.78. We are ahead in the Building because of extra gifts being given for the debt of the Garage/Maintenance Building.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Mile Offering really helped bring down our deficit. Ninety-four (94) families have gave \$19,625.00. THANK YOU to all who gave for this special effort. It is not too late to use that special envelope you received in the mail.

It is not too late to make your pledge for 2020. The Finance Committee is now in the process of putting together the 2020 budget.

As we come to the end of the year, think about these words from Thom Rainer in a book, "I Will". First, he (Paul) tells the church (in Corinth) that their spiritual growth will be in direct relation to their generous giving. "Remember this: The person who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the person who sows generously will reap generously."

#### **BUILDING AND GROUNDS FOUNDATION**

It has been many months since we reported on this Foundation. Since the beginning of the year this Foundation has received \$1,260.00 in gifts and memorials. It has now grown to have \$274,379.35 in given-assets. In 2018 dividend and interest income from this invested amount was \$17,682.16. \$15,000 of this went into our home budget to help take care of property needs (utilities, insurance, repairs, etc.).

So far this year 34 families have made gifts to this Foundation. Gifts of \$450.00 were received in memory of Elizabeth Kuhnert. A gift of \$100.00 was received from a couple who was married here.

As our buildings age (and we have several), this foundation becomes increasingly important. We started this fund so that we would never have to decrease staff in order to keep up our buildings and properties.

There is an envelope for this foundation in the front of your packet. Let me encourage you to use it, whatever the size of your gift. Also, please remember this need with your memorials and when you make your will or trust.

Happy New Year! God has brought us into a new Church year! And each new Church year begins with the Season of Advent.

Advent means coming, or arrival, or appearance. Advent focuses our attention on our Lord's coming to us.

Still, you might find it strange that the thought emphasized on the Last Sunday of the Church Year is carried over into Advent. Just like the Last Sunday of the Church Year Advent also directs our attention forward in time to our Lord's Second Coming. But I think there's a subtle difference in this in Advent.

I see the Last Sunday of the Church Year pointing us forward to this event, this actual, future return of our Lord in power and great glory. But in Advent, I think the emphasis is on the <u>promise</u> of the Coming of Christ.

Yes, I know, this is a subtle difference. Still, the idea of promise flows into two other aspects that come into focus during the Season of Advent.

The first is obvious. The Season of Advent offers time to prepare to celebrate Christmas. And our preparation isn't putting up Christmas decorations and buying Christmas presents. We prepare for Christmas by recalling all the many Old Testament promises— prophecies— God made about His Son's First Advent. Through His Word (God's prophecies and promises), He makes us ready to rightly rejoice in our Lord's Nativity (birth).

The second truth is not as obvious. The Season of Advent highlights how God fulfills His promises to us in the here and now. Because Jesus was born as God promised, we can be certain of the promises God fulfills, but our eyes can't see. For example,

every time two or three gather in Jesus' name, as God promised, Jesus is present with them (Matthew 18:20). So too, each time the Gospel and Sacraments are used, God is keeping His promises. We can see this with our eyes, but as promised God is creating and strengthening faith. God granting forgiveness. And God is sending His Spirit and His Spirit's gifts of hope, joy, and peace; life so we live for Him in this world, as we will live with Him eternally.

And that brings us back to the third aspect of Advent. Through the Gospel and Sacraments, God is making us ready for the Day Jesus returns and all His promises stand fulfilled!

The Season of Advent is followed not by just by Christmas, but the <u>Season</u> of Christmas. In the Bible, important events— like weddings— lasted many days. This fact is reflected in the calendar Christians have used for more than a thousand years. Christmas is the first of twelve days that make up the <u>Season</u> of Christmas. Christmas is far too significant an event to celebrate for one day only. We celebrate it for nearly two weeks! Then, thirteen days after Christmas a new season begins, the Season of Epiphany. And the Season of Epiphany begins on January 6.

But I get ahead of myself (I'll write about Epiphany in my January newsletter article). Back to Advent. Throughout history, Christians have observed Advent with a number of traditions. Below are some suggestions for you.

1. Make use of Advent wreath. This is a great way to connect your home devotions to the worship life of our congregation. On the First Sunday in Advent you will see an Advent wreath up front in the chancel. Use one at home. Gather as a family, perhaps after dinner, and take turns lighting the candles on the outside ring. Follow what we do in Church. And finally, on Christmas Eve you get to light the inside candle. And around the wreath read a devotion and say a prayer (I've included a prayer for each week in Advent and for Christmas at the end of this article).

2. Sing or speak the words of the great Advent hymn, "O Come, O Come Emmanuel". Our hymnbook also offers prayers that follow the theme presented in each verse.

3. If your family has small children, make use of a Nativity Set. This can be a great way to keep your focus on Christ. Read and teach your children the Christmas narrative and help build up their anticipation for the celebration of Christ's birth. Put the stable and the manger on one side of the room and the Holy Family on the other side. Each Sunday in Advent move Mary and Joseph little closer to the stable and talk about all that happened before and after Mary and Joseph arrived in Bethlehem. 4. Attend the Wednesday Advent dinners and services at Trinity. Dinner is 5:00-6:30 p.m. and the service is at 7 p.m. The Lord bless you with strong confidence fixed in all God's promises in Christ,

During: You go to the nursing homes first. You sing a few songs at each place. The group leader helps choose the songs. Then, you go to homes. If a person is home, you sing a few songs for them. (Sometimes the shut-ins have requests!  $\odot$  ) It usually takes about an hour to carol to everyone.

After: When you are finished caroling to everyone on your list, you return to the church basement to enjoy a light meal and fellowship!

#### Health Note for December 2019: Decluttering for Christmas (reprinted from Lutheran Parish Nurse International, lpni.org, with permission)

When our children were young, for me to be able to work part time as a registered nurse in a local nursing home, I had to work one holiday. I chose to work 3-11 on Christmas Day. By this time of day, our children would be getting tired of the toy excitement of Christmas, and we didn't have family near us to have a big traditional dinner. So, I was content to work this shift. What I didn't know was that after I had left for work that Christmas Day, my husband had our children clean out their closets! On Christmas Day, really?!? They thought they were being punished and "celebrating" Christmas in a "work camp" environment!!! Bo, my husband, said that after the initial shock of having to do this onerous chore, the children actually enjoyed it because they found past favorites and "treasures" that they had long forgotten.

Thinking about cleaning the clutter out of closets, makes me think that we should declutter our lives during this spiritually eventful time and concentrate on the true meaning of Christmas, the Birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus! We need to relax some on the traditional hectic festivities of buying gifts, planning and attending parties, and preparing for the several course traditional dinner. All of this can be fun, but it also can be so very stressful. 
