### <u>LENT</u>

Lent starts on February 26<sup>th</sup>, Ash Wednesday. Pastor Reed will be bringing the messages. Reminder that during Lent, Wednesday School is at 5:30 p.m. The Lenten Services will be at 7:00 p.m. Easter this year is on April 12<sup>th</sup>. If your little ones begin to cry or scream during the worship services, please take them to the narthex, Mother's Room, or Child Care Center. It is hard to preach, for the soloists or choir to sing, or people to concentrate when one or more are loudly making their presence known.

Also, as soon as the acolyte appears to light the candles and the musicians begin the prelude, all talking should cease. Most of the time it does when the prelude comes from the altar. But, I've noticed that when the prelude comes from the piano or violin, there are folks who keep talking. This should not be. It is a disservice to the people playing who have worked hard preparing for their ministry of music. We are really blessed to have all the music people we do. They spend hours preparing on Thursday nights and several hours here every Sunday.

Finally, please remember that rules of hospitality:

- a. Arrive early so you aren't rushed.
- b. Offer a warm greeting to each person, starting with the person in front of you.
- c. Be on the lookout for people who are alone or lost. Say "Hi!"
- d. Introduce yourself and learn people's names.
- e. Introduce people to others you know.
- f. Take responsibility welcoming those within 10 feet of you, especially those who may be alone.
- g. Spend at least 3 minutes before and after worship talking to someone you don't know well.

Finally, #2 – Pray for your church Trinity, for spiritual and numerical growth, for the growth of our Bible classes, for our Kennedy Callers and evangelism outreach, for our financial picture, for Trinity School and Sunday, for revival and a new zeal for the mission Christ Jesus has given us. And thank God for all who are already working hard to make all the above happen.

Please remember that the envelopes for these special ministries are in the front of your packet. We pray that in the course of the year, every member will use each of these envelopes. In February our focus will be on the Lutheran Hour and its many ministries.

Several have used their "Initial Offering" and "Portals of Prayer" envelopes. If you have not, please do so soon. \$3.75 in the Initial Offering envelope covers the cost of envelopes and \$4.80 in the Portals of Prayer envelope will cover the year-cost of this devotional booklet.

The debt on our Garage/Maintenance Building is now \$39,545.60. Please remember that the second Sunday of the month (February 9<sup>th</sup>) is "Debt Down Sunday". Extra gifts received through the Building Fund that day go to pay down principle.

We are still looking for 2020 KAIR Broadcast sponsors. As of this writing we have 19. We need 33 more. Costs is \$50.00 per Sunday.

To meet our 2020 budget, we need \$18,499.48 per week for HOME, \$820.20 per week for MISSIONS and \$634.62 per week for BUILDING, a TOTAL of \$19,954.30 per week. That is why the giving of each member of Trinity is so important every Sunday. I read this recently, something to think about. "To love money is to place a value on it that exceeds what God says it is worth. If we love money we can never give a smile, we can never be free and joyous. God's desire is not that we go through life simply collecting things and holding on to them. Instead, he wants us to give and give and give, just as he himself does. True generosity is joyful.

### **SCHOOL GRANT FUND**

In January, the Trinity Lutheran School Grant Fund received \$1,134.40. This brings the total given assets of this fund to \$379,748.04. In 2019, this fund received \$9,308.62 in gifts and memorials. From the invested assets of this fund we received \$19,448.24 in dividend and interest income. This then was given in grants and scholarships to children attending our Trinity School, 38 children from 23 families.

From the School Christmas Programs the fund received \$714.64. From Thrivent Choice Dollars \$2,746.50 was received during the year. \$761.00 came from the circus and \$433.00 from the 8<sup>th</sup> grade Graduation. Memorials were Mike Shannon, \$250.00; Carilyn Blasi, \$1,672.00

This fund is tremendously important to our Trinity Lutheran School. Although our tuition is low compared to other Christian Day Schools, there are still many who cannot meet it. We do not want to ever deny a Christian education for financial reasons.

### Health Note for February

February is heart month sponsored by the American Heart association. Also, February 7th is Wear Red Day. Wear Red Day and The Red Dress symbol was started in 2002 to remind women of the need to protect their heart health and inspire them to take action. I was surprised to learn that heart disease is

the number 1 killer of all women, taking more lives than all forms of cancer combined. Heart disease claims the lives of 1 in 3 women. It is important to note women tend to disregard symptoms of heart attack more than men partially because of the still common idea that a heart



attack is a man's disease, and partially because women are more likely to have the more uncommon symptoms of a heart attack. Signs and symptoms of heart attack are: 1) uncomfortable pressure, squeezing fullness or pain in the center of your chest. It lasts more than a few minutes or goes away and comes back; 2) pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw, or stomach; 3) shortness of breath with or without chest discomfort; 4) other signs such as breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea, or lightheadedness; 5) as with men, women's most common heart attack symptom is chest pain or discomfort. But women are somewhat more likely than men to experience the some of the other common symptoms, particularly shortness of breath, nausea/vomiting, and back or jaw pain. The good news is that there are steps you can take to lower your risk for heart disease: don't smoke, stay active, manage blood sugar, work with your health care provider to get blood pressure under control, lower cholesterol levels if higher then recommended, and manage weight. I know these aren't always easy changes to make but knowing the benefits can motivate you to start making small positive changes. The American Heart Association reports that in older women (average age 79) reducing sedentary (non-active) time by only 1 hour a day reduced the risk of heart disease by 26% and the risk of cardiovascular disease overall by 12%. Also, that the activity didn't have to happen all at once; it could be accumulated throughout the day. As a person who tends toward being a "couch potato" that is good news!

# Lent begins February 26<sup>th</sup> with Ash Wednesday

Dear Friends,

"I'm giving up Lent for Lent."

That's what one person said to his pastor as Ash Wednesday approached. He considered Lent to be a time of doom and gloom. He wasn't going to use the extra opportunities for worship during Lent. And it seems that many people agree. Just look at the attendance in the extra services during Lent.

What is Lent? Is Lent worth it? Is Lent simply a season of doom and gloom?

Of course not! Christians have observed Lent for centuries. Lent is a time to prepare to joyfully celebrate Easter and the greatest event in world history and salvation history: the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead! For many hundreds of years Christians have considered Lent to be worthwhile.

In the early church, adult candidates for Baptism used the 40 days before Easter (Sundays are not counted) to intensify their study and instruction. They were preparing to be baptized and received into church membership at the Easter Vigil (the night before Easter Sunday). From this developed the Season of Lent. Christians realized these 40 days before Easter were a good time to get ready to celebrate their Lord's victory over great and powerful enemies: Satan and sin, death and the grave.



I'm sure you've long understood the importance of Lent. Still, below are some suggestions that may make Lent more meaningful to you this year.

• Worship often. During Lent our congregation will expand the opportunities for worship. We offer special services on Ash Wednesday, the Wednesdays in Lent, and on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday during Holy Week. Take advantage of these extra opportunities to hear about God's great love for you in Jesus Christ and to grow in faith. Look at Lent as an opportunity to "walk" with Christ to the cross and empty tomb. Lent is a time to thank God: that the Father was willing to give His Son to save you, that God's Son was willing to enter this world to suffer and die for you, and that the Holy Spirit is willing to dwell in you and give you faith in Jesus.

• Read the Scriptures. If currently you do not have a habit of reading the Bible each day, Lent is a great time to start. Ask Pastor Ziegler, me, or a mature Christian friend about how to begin. You can join your fellow believers at Trinity in reading through the Bible this year (the schedule printed in the weekly bulletin). Or you can read through one of the Gospels during Lent. Or you can read all four accounts of the suffering and death of Jesus in the Gospels (Matthew 26-27; Mark 14-15; Luke 22-23; John 18-19). Read your Bible at the same time each day. If you miss a day, don't quit; get back to reading the Bible the next day. And start small. Set aside perhaps 10 minutes of so at the beginning. Then you can gradually add more time.

• Pray. Use Lent as an opportunity to grow in your prayer life. Use the prayer sheet included in each week's bulletin. Keep your own set of 3x5 index cards and list people and concerns to pray about. Pray daily for these people and concerns. And a good time to pray is right after reading the Bible. Praying at the same time each day will help develop prayer into a habit.

• Remember the hungry. Some Christians "give up" something during Lent, to remember the sacrifice Jesus made for their salvation. You may want to do that, too. Or, you might want to skip one meal each week during Lent and give the money saved to world hunger or our congregation's food pantry.

• Remember the poor. Lent also has been a time when Christians have remembered the poor. Ancient believers called their gifts to the poor "giving alms." Lent is a great time to find ways to show Christian love for those less fortunate.

May the Lord bless you and all who confess Christ as we enter Lent this Ash Wednesday, February 26<sup>th</sup>.
