On Sunday, July 26th, we had the Rite of Ordination here at Trinity for my grandson, Tyler Arends. Tyler graduated from Concordia Seminary, Fort Wayne, on May 22nd. He has accepted a Call to Trinity Lutheran Church, Guymon, Oklahoma and will be Installed there on August 9th. We pray God's blessings upon him as he begins his ministry there.

Thank you to all our members who did so much to make the Ordination Service so beautiful and special. To Debbie for making the worship booklet, to Pastor Reed for leading the service, to Rick and Glen and Bart the ushers, to the Adult Choir, Melissa and Jeremy and Jacob, to Jim and Joyce, to Terry Mills for baking the cake and doing the reception and for all the members who came to worship and participate and to the folks I'm probably overlooking. The offering for the Fort Wayne Seminary was \$386.00 (very good). The service was streamed and the last I heard over 400 people viewed it.

50th ANNIVERSARY SCHOOL ENDOWMENT

We continue to receive gifts for our 50th Anniversary School Endowment Fund Offering. As of this writing we have received 82 gifts and a total of \$27,505.00. Please note in this Newsletter the special page listing those who have given and when they graduated from Trinity. If your name is there, we thank you for remembering and for your gift. If you have children whose names should be there, but ARE NOT, please encourage them to remember and send a gift. If they have graduated since 1969, they have benefited from the School Endowment Fund, from the giving of others. There are still several years with no names. It would be great if every year had names under it. We pray that that will soon be so. Please note "Friends of Trinity School". These are folks who have given even though they did not attend Trinity. Please note also, the names of former teachers who have sent gifts. We are hoping that many more "friends" will give. Simply mark your gift, "50th Anniversary". Please help us make our GOAL of \$50,000, we have a ways to go.

ATTENDANCE

On June 7th we went back to our regular Sunday schedule worship services at 8:00 and 10:30 a.m., and 6:30 p.m. For the first four Sundays we did quite well. Attendance was 204, 229, 254, 256. But then the Governor issued the mandate that all should wear masks. That has really cut our attendance. The last three weeks attendance has been 147, 185, 191. Sunday School and Bible Class attendance has also been hurt. Before the virus hit our attendance average was 321. We pray that God in some way will soon bring an end to the spread of the virus.

ADULT INQUIRER'S CLASS

Adult Inquirer's Class begins again at 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 30th. If you have not been through this Class we encourage you to come this Fall. If you have been through the class, invite your spouse, a child, a friend, a relative to come to the class and offer to come with them. You may be the only person who can bring salvation and heaven to that person. An enrollment blank is in the bulletin or simply call the church office.

WEDNESDAY SCHOOL

We have not yet set the starting date for Wednesday School Remember that ministry is preparation for confirmation and is for youth in grades 5-8 who do not attend Trinity School. Please watch the bulletin for more information.

SCHOOL REGISTRATION

Registration for Trinity School will be on August 6th. Have you considered giving your child a Christian education? Every day, in every grade, God's Word is taught, and Scripture is memorized. Christ Jesus is held high. Each day begins and ends with prayer. The wonders of God at work in our lives are pointed to. Most churches do not have a Christian school as part of their ministry. Trinity is blessed to have one. We pray that you will give your children this blessing. As I watch the news and see what young people are doing in the streets of our cities. I remember the works of Teddy Roosevelt (whose statue in New York City they have taken down) who said, "Education without God simply makes clever devils". The tuition at Trinity School is really low and for that we have grants and scholarships. No child is turned away from our school because of finances. Our debt on the Garage/Maintenance Building is now \$32,240.58. Please remember that the second Sunday of the month (August 9th) is "Debt Down Sunday". Extra gifts received through the Building Fund that day go to pay down principle.

July 26th was the day of our Annual Offering for Dream Fund III. This year our goal is "\$120 In '020". So far forty-one (41) families have given \$4,830.00. You received a letter about our building plans and Dream Fund III and in it a pink envelope for a generous gift that will help "Build a Dream that will Endure".

Since Trinity School will open this month, it is time to begin asking for School Sponsors. We need 40. We now have six (6). A School Sponsor gives \$200.00 to help a child go to Trinity School. Simply mark your gift "SCHOOL SPONSOR".

*How firm a foundation, O saints of the Lord,
Is laid for your faith in His excellent Word!
What more can He say than to you He has said
Who unto the Savior for refuge have fled?*

Dear Fellow Redeemed,

A firm foundation. That's what we need! When everything around us seems to be changing, shifting, and uncertain, we need a firm place to stand. A firm foundation makes all the difference.

We Christians have and continue to have a firm foundation. All we need, God gives to us in His excellent Word!

Right around now, we may be wondering how will the saints of the Lord, the Church, look after this pandemic is over? Will the Church ever be the same? Or are some things never going back to the way they were before?

Let me assure you— let God's excellent Word assure you— the Church will always be the same!

Yes, during this pandemic we have adapted and adjusted. Think of how the saints quickly put together live-streaming for the worship service (thanks, Jeremy). Think of how good these were from the get-go and how they've continued to improve as the weeks passed by. Think about how the saints (our school teachers) adapted and instruction continued via home packets and technology before the end of the last school year. Also for some of our Sunday school and Bible classes. Great!

Still, the Church— the capital "C" Church— has not changed. In or out of a pandemic, the Church proclaims Jesus and His gifts. The Church still has His excellent Word, the Gospel. The Church is and will always be all about Jesus.

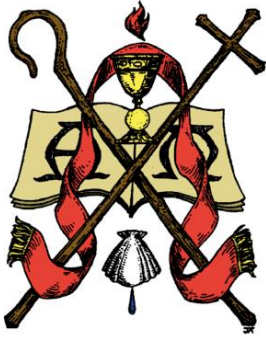
Yes, when this pandemic is over, when the sheltering-in-place saints come forth, what will they find when they return to Trinity? The same Church!

Antidote for Worry

One of my favorite passages of Scripture is found in Matthew, chapter six, where Jesus says:

25 "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more important than food, and the body more important than clothes? 26 Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? 27 Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life? 28 "And why do you worry about clothes? See how the lilies of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. 29 Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. 30 If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? 31 So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' 32 For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. 33 But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Matthew 6:25-33 (NIV)

These verses follow immediately after Jesus has said:

19 "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. 20 But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. 21 For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. 24 "No one can serve two masters. Either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and Money. Matthew 6:19-21, 24 (NIV)

What causes us worry? It might be fear of not being able to pay our bills. It might be over health issues. It might be strained relationships with others. I believe we worry because we think we have to fix whatever is causing us worry, and our conclusion is that we don't know how we can fix our situation. The bottom line is the reason we worry is because we are putting our trust in ourselves. Jesus' point in Matthew six is that God is big enough to handle what is beyond our ability, and if we put our trust in God our reason for worry is eliminated.

The Apostle Peter makes the same point in his first letter where he wrote to first century believers who probably had much more reason for worry than we do when he wrote:

6 Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time he may exalt you, 7 casting all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you. 1 Peter 5:6-7 (ESV)

By "humble" Peter meant to trust God. This is the key to ridding ourselves of worry. If we trust God for forgiveness and peace through Jesus' death and resurrection for us, we should also trust him with our daily lives.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



1. What makes Trinity different?

We believe in helping every student grow academically, in character, and in faith. We excitedly proclaim salvation in Jesus Christ in all that we do. Our approach to education and classroom management is motivated by the understanding that every student is a unique child of God and loved by Him. Our teachers work to help the students live moral lives that value themselves and others. We also want our children to experience the wonders of His creation and have regular opportunities for enrichment with field trips and other extra-curricular activities.

2. What are the class sizes?

The average class size is 10-15 students. Our teachers K-8 hold a KS teaching license and participate in continuing education to improve their knowledge and skills.

3. What is the cost to send my child(ren)?

Trinity offers Preschool for children ages 3 and 4. The cost for the PK3 program is \$650 (\$65 per month) for the year. The cost for the PK4 program is \$850 (\$85 per month) for the full year. PK programs require a \$50 enrollment fee. Registration begins in March.

Grant and Aid: Tuition assistance is available to families. There is a \$35 non-reimbursable application fee. For more information refer to the Parent Handbook or contact our office.

Our school utilizes a tuition management system called FACTS. Navigate to the school website at www.tlsks.org and go to the Admissions tab for information, including Financial Aid.

4. Is Trinity a KS accredited school? Yes. Trinity participates in the KS State Assessments.

5. What is the curriculum?

Our curriculum is based on the KS College and Career Standards. Our religion curriculum is through One in Christ. We integrate technology in our instruction and assessment and use data to focus on student strengths and needs.

6. Does Trinity have extra-curricular opportunities?

Yes. Students have opportunity to participate in Athletics (grades 4-8 depending on sport) and Academic Competitions with other Lutheran Schools. We also participate in the Gathering of the Talents through Concordia University.

7. Can my child attend if they are not of the Lutheran faith?

Of course! We are here to serve all students and families in the community who desire a quality Christian education. We have many students from different congregations.

8. If my child has special needs, is Trinity able to provide services?

Trinity receives support through Atchison Public Schools (USD 409) Special Education services for students who are on IEPs. Services such as speech, PT, and OT are administered on site. Trinity also receives Title I services through USD 409 where students are identified for additional help in math and reading. Those services are provided on site.

9. How do students get to and from school?

Families are responsible for getting their children to and from school. Carpooling is encouraged. We do not provide bus transportation.

10. What do students wear?

Trinity has a standardized dress code. We believe standardized dress improves academic focus and helps create an orderly educational environment for our students.
