FUNERAL SERVICE

She went out on both Monday evenings and Thursday mornings, making hundreds of calls and training other callers. After she could no longer go calling, she had a "card ministry", sending birthday, get well and other cards to our service men and women as well as others. She was also a devotional leader at Senior Village and a prayer warrior to the end of her life. We pray the Lord's comfort to her family.

SUNDAY SERVICES

On June 7th, we went back to our regular Sunday schedule; worship services at 8:00 and 10:30 a.m., 6:30 p.m., and Bible Classes and Sunday School at 9:15 a.m. Average attendance has been 230. He is the one who every week has put everything together to make possible the streaming and has run the camera, etc.

NEW DOORS

Soon there will be new doors on the west and south sides of the Education Building. Costs: \$10,360.00. To me it is still the "new" buildings and when someone says something needs replacing I think "why"? It's new. But then I have to remind myself that this month the "new" building is 31 years old. To most of us at Trinity it is not "new".


.....June 15, Jon Schultz was installed as Trinity's first DCE.

SCHOOL GRANT FUND

Since January the School Grant Fund has received \$7,317.00 in gifts and memorials. This brings the given-assets of this Fund to \$387,065.04. Last year the dividend and interest income from this invested amount was \$19,448.24. This income was given in grants and scholarships to children attending Trinity School. Last year 38 children received these grants and scholarships.

The following memorials were received for this fund: Doug Goodpasture-\$1,190.00; Nub Schrader-\$395.00.

When we started the School Grant Fund in May 1995 (note it is now 25 years old), this is what we wrote, "It is our DREAM that every family that wants to send its children to Trinity Lutheran School will be able to do so, that no child will ever be turned away for financial reasons. If help is needed for registration fees, books, uniform costs, whatever, it will be available."

BUILDING & GROUNDS FOUNDATION

Since the first of the year, the Building and Grounds Foundation has received \$592.00 in gifts. This foundation now has assets of \$275,772.35. Last year

the income from this invested amount was \$18,143.61. Of this amount, \$16,000 is going into our 2020 budget for properties and utilities expense. The rest of that income is used for expenses that arise which are not covered in the Grounded in Faith budget.



When we started this foundation in 1982, this is what we wrote: "It is our DREAM that our buildings and grounds will be some of the most beautiful in Atchison. It is our dream that there will be beautiful trees, shrubs, lawns, flowers, walks, playgrounds and parking lots, that all our buildings will be well kept and in good repair, that when people come here to worship, fellowship, learn and grow, they will be uplifted and inspired by the beauty they behold."

If you are 20-35 years old, Trinity has a Bible study just for you! Pastor Reed is leading a class for this age group right now. Class is meeting in the school cafeteria, and right now they are studying the book of Esther. Hope to see you.

Dear Fellow Redeemed,

Expectations. In life we have to fulfill many expectations.

To keep a job, you are required to show up for work and to do the work you were hired to do. To get good grades in school, you must go to class, to do all the assigned work, study, and get good scores on tests. To be a citizen of the United States, you are expected to obey the laws, to be patriotic, and to pay your taxes.

Yet, when it comes to our life in Christ, our blessings as citizens of God's kingdom, this isn't the case. In God's kingdom we are free! The Apostle Paul wrote, "It was for freedom that Christ set us free" (Galatians 5:1).

The Bible teaches that all that all our blessings in Christ are free. Take, for example, eternal salvation. "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast" (Ephesians 2:8-9).

When Paul wrote about our spiritual freedom in Christ, he compared this to the image of slavery. In Galatians 5:1, the verse I cited above about freedom, Paul also wrote, "Stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery."

There is a danger of us returning to a life of spiritual slavery. Why would anyone choose to be a slave? That would be ridiculous! Yet, you might remember that's what many among God's people wanted to do right after God freed them from slavery in Egypt.

One way we return to slavery is by acting like we must fulfill certain demands and expectations to receive the blessings and benefits found in Christ.

Think about it: if our blessings depend on us and what we do, we will never know whether we're truly blessed by God or not. Why? In this world we are always sinners and sinners are always imperfect. Sinners can never do what must be done in order to gain a blessing.

The benefits and blessings found in Christ are God's free gifts to you. And in Jesus you are not only free, you are God's child. God's child!

And in a family relationship, demands and expectations shouldn't enter the picture as they do in a master-slave relationship.

Instead, a child—especially a little child—looks to his or her parents, depends on his or her parents, and loves his or her parents. And in love, a child listens, and learns, and follows his or her parents.

In Christ, you are not a slave. In Christ you are free; you have freedom. Even more, in Christ you are a child. No spiritual demands and expectations are put upon you. You love to your heavenly Father and you welcome your heavenly Father's guidance and direction. As God's child, you can't help but listen and learn from your heavenly Father, and follow Him.

That is who you are in Christ! Free! Stand firm in your freedom in Christ!

Health Note for July 2020 - Summertime

Just wanted to remind everyone of a few safety tips for outdoor activity as we head into what is usually the hottest part of the summer.

- 1) wear light colored clothing, light colors tend to reflect the sunlight while dark colors absorb it
- 2) wear loose clothing, this allows air to get to your skin for easier evaporation of sweat for cooling
- 3) the greatest chance for sunburn is from 10AM to 3PM, utilize any shade, wear a hat that shades your face, AND use sunscreen
- 4) generally, the hottest part of the day is from 4PM to 6PM and the heat will affect you more if the humidity is high because your natural cooling system, evaporation of sweat, is less effective than when the air is drier

Be aware of when your body is becoming over heated. If you get muscle cramps while you are engaged in activity in the heat, it usually means your body is signaling you to slow down, cool down, and rehydrate! (water or drinks that replace electrolytes, avoid caffeinated drinks and alcohol to rehydrate) Also be aware that if you have heart disease, being out in the summer heat will put stress on your heart. The heart pumps harder and faster in the heat to redirect blood to your skin for cooling. It is estimated the heart must pump 2 to 4 times more blood each minute than it does on a cool day. Use common sense and enjoy being outdoors this summer!

TRINITY LUTHERAN SCHOOL FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. What makes Trinity different?

We believe in helping every student grow academically, in character, and in faith. We excitedly proclaim salvation in Jesus Christ in all that we do. Our approach to education and classroom management is motivated by the understanding that every student is a unique child of God and loved by Him. Our teachers work to help the students live moral lives that value themselves and others. We also want our children to experience the wonders of His creation and have regular



opportunities for enrichment with field trips and other extra-curricular activities.

2. What are the class sizes?

The average class size is 10-15 students. Our teachers K-8 hold a KS teaching license and participate in continuing education to improve their knowledge and skills.

3. What is the cost to send my child(ren)?

Trinity offers Preschool for children ages 3 and 4. The cost for the PK3 program is \$650 (\$65 per month) for the year. The cost for the PK4 program is \$850 (\$85 per month) for the full year. PK programs require a \$50 enrollment fee. Registration begins in March.

4. Is Trinity a KS accredited school? Yes. Trinity participates in the KS State Assessments.

5. What is the curriculum?

Our curriculum is based on the KS College and Career Standards. Our religion curriculum is through One in Christ. We integrate technology in our instruction and assessment and use data to focus on student strengths and needs.

6. Does Trinity have extra-curricular opportunities?

Yes. Students have opportunity to participate in Athletics (grades 4-8 depending on sport) and Academic Competitions with other Lutheran Schools. We also participate in the Gathering of the Talents through Concordia University.

7. Can my child attend if they are not of the Lutheran faith?

Of course! We are here to serve all students and families in the community who desire a quality Christian education. We have many students from different congregations.

8. If my child has special needs, is Trinity able to provide services?

Trinity receives support through Atchison Public Schools (USD 409) Special Education services for students who are on IEPs. Services such as speech, PT, and OT are administered on site. Trinity also receives Title I services through USD 409 where students are identified for additional help in math and reading. Those services are provided on site.

9. How do students get to and from school?

Families are responsible for getting their children to and from school. Carpooling is encouraged. We do not provide bus transportation.

10. What do students wear?

Trinity has a standardized dress code. We believe standardized dress improves academic focus and helps create an orderly educational environment for our students.
