At the end of October in the HOME budget we are BEHIND \$31,554.62. In the MISSION budget we are BEHIND \$1,877.35 and in the BUILDING budget we are AHEAD \$133.68. In our 2nd Mile Offering 82 families very generously gave \$14,228.00. On our deficit this helped us gain only \$511.85. What the 2nd Mile Offering did was help the deficit from being bigger. And this made it a REAL BLESSING. We are praying that by the end of the year we will be able to do more catching up.

Gifts continue to come for "\$122 in '022". Eightyseven families have now given \$11,088.00 for this special effort. These gifts go into Dream Fund III.

MINISTRY - 2023

Our Finance Committee working with the projections made by our other committees, have put together the proposed budget for 2023. The figures are big, but they make possible the work done here at Trinity in the Name of our Lord Jesus.

Our budget for 2022 is \$1,139,310.00. The proposed budget for 2023 is \$1,182,337.50, an increase of \$43,027.50, or 3.78%. We <u>want</u> to increase the salaries by \$16,464.50 which includes 23 full and part-time workers. Health insurance, Social Security and retirement plans <u>will</u> increase \$12,815.00. This increase is a must, we have no choice. The property budget, which includes utilities, insurance, cleaning supplies, etc., will increase \$8,235.00. We want to increase our mission budget to the District, which we have not increased for years, by \$1,000.00.

To do what we propose to do we will have to make up what we were behind on this year's budget. We had a shortfall of \$59,646.00 when we adopted this year's budget. We have given more this year than last, but at the present, we are short half of the above short-fall.

We have been able to do and are now able to do what we are doing because we have many generous people here at Trinity. We are praying that every member of Trinity will see that as a member he or she is called to be a disciple – a follower of Jesus, worshiping, serving, witnessing, giving. To really believe is to really do. Loyalty Sunday is on November 20. It will be a day of challenge and commitment, a call to loyalty, a call to say a loud AMEN – yes, Lord, I'm with you.

Health Topic November 2022

HOW OLD ARE YOU?

Why is it that some people do not like to be asked, "How old are you?" Let me suggest that one of the primary reasons is that our culture and society has ingrained in us that aging is something to deny rather than something to celebrate as a gift from the Lord! In Gen. 5:21-27 we learn that the Lord gifted Methuselah with 969 years!

It has been going on for a long time. Remember Frank Sinatra crooning, "Fairy tales can come true it can happen to you, when you're young at heart?" Notice the Hallmark greeting cards that continue to degrade and make fun of anyone between 40 and 80 with black balloons, "over-the-hill" language, and a general sense of negativism and decay? There is an overarching mindset running rampant in today's society that proclaims, "It's bad to be old!"

"Old" is connected with the image of "mold" rather than of "gold". We talk about "senior moments" but usually forget about the "junior moments" we all experienced in high school! Ironic, isn't it, that young people want to grow older, and many older people want to be younger!

But fear not, older people of God! It is about time that we speak up with shouts of "We are never too old, and it's never too late to celebrate!" *Gray hair is a crown of splendor*. Proverbs 16:31a NIV. Wear your crown proudly!

We need not feel guilty of this phenomenon. After all, our society has never had to deal with 10,000 people turning 65 every day, which is currently happening. It is mind-boggling to realize that in the history of the world, two-thirds of the people who have ever lived to be 65 or over are alive today! *Remember the days of old; consider the generations long past. Ask your father and he will tell you; your elders and they will explain to you.* Deuteronomy 32:7 NIV

So why not just "claim our age" and thank the Lord daily for another day to serve and celebrate him? The great thing about getting older is that we do not lose all of the other ages we've already been! We learn from them. "Age fullness" is the sum of all of our experiences and what we've gained from them!

Living and aging cannot be separated. Aging is not a disease. It is the process of living each day in the grace, mercy, and love of the Lord! Aging means living – and living means aging!

This is why I enjoy talking about the fact that "aging is the only way to live!" Attributing decline to aging rather than illness perpetuates the negative stereotype of older people as frail and debilitated. An anti-aging mindset is really nothing more than an anti-living mindset. Aging is not a disease but rather the natural process of continuing to live life to the full, knowing the Lord continues to love and care for us as we continue to serve and celebrate life in all ways possible!

So, aging people of God, let's continue to shout out to others, younger and older, "We're old and we're bold!" Don't get over it! Get used to it and get on with it!"

Let's have more discussions with our peers and with those younger than us. Let us age with pride rather than just trying to remember the "good old days"! There are still more "good days" coming as well, including today. As we age, it seems as though it gets easier to focus on what truly matters. Perhaps others around us will grasp that concept as well and will unite with us to change the negative mindset of aging into seeing it as a positive journey!

So, let me ask you, "How old are you?" I am 82 and proud of it! I encourage you to speak boldly and bravely about your age as well, even using fractions to be precisely correct, and rejoicing each day in the gift of life in the Lord! Join me, and many others, in being an O.A.T – An Older Adult in Training!

BUILDING AND GOUNDS FOUNDATION

The last time we reported on this endowment fund was in the April Newsletter. At that time the fund had given assets of \$321,686.15. Today it has given assets of \$482,931.92. This tremendous increase has come from the estate of Amelia Cawthorn. Amelia was secretary of the Properties Committee for some 40 years. In that position she became very aware of the cost of utilities, insurance, repairs and upkeep. We received a check for \$160,653.77 from Edward Jones for securities which it held in Amelia's name. This gift will add several thousand dollars in dividend income from this fund. We remember Amelia for her generosity and thank our Lord for this gift.

Along with this gift the foundation in the last several months has also received many gifts ranging from 2.00 to \$100.00 Every gift counts and many put together add up to much.

We started the Building and Grounds Foundation in October 1982, forty years ago. As buildings and facilities grow older, congregations sometimes lay off staff in order to maintain the buildings. That takes away from ministry and adds to the gradual decline and eventual death of a congregation. We do not want that ever to happen here at Trinity. We do not spend any of the principal of this fund. We use only dividend and interest income. And because of inflation and increasing costs we must continue to build assets so that dividend income will increase.

This is why there is a special envelope in the front of your packet, and we continue to ask for gifts, memorials and bequests for this fund. Thank you to all who have given gifts the past 40 years.
