OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

Trinity Lutheran Church was very involved in Operation Christmas Child. We collected items all year and with those items the Middle and High School youth (along with some Girl Scouts) packed 100 boxes. The congregation donated another 18 boxes, bringing us to a total of 118 boxes as a Church.

We are also a Drop-off Location. This means other community members brought their boxes to us. We boxed them up and brought them to St. Joseph. In St. Joseph, they put them on a Semi and took them to the processing center where they will be shipped overseas. As a Drop-off Location we collected 332 boxes. As a part of the St. Joseph regional team, we collected 8,114 boxes. Our regional team goal was 7,911, so we surpassed our goal. I would like to thank some people who made this possible. TRINITY CHURCH ENDOWMENT FUND

It has been over a year since we last reported on the Trinity Lutheran Church Endowment Fund. When we established this fund in 1984, this is what we wrote:

"It is our DREAM that Trinity will eventually have a full-time Director of Youth and one of the finest youth ministries in the Kansas District. It is also our dream that one day Trinity will have a full-time Director of Music and a fine coral and instrumental music program in both church and school. We look forward to the day when continuing education will be available for each staff member each year, when our secretaries will be well-paid and have the best of equipment with which to work, that through this fund adequate resources will always be available for our evangelism, outreach, and public relations ministries."

Through the years the interest dividend income from this fund has been used for our youth, evangelism, music and public relation ministries.

This year this fund has received \$79,741.90. \$78,888.42 of this amount came from the estate of Amelia Cawthorn who had directed that the money from the sale of her home would go to this fund. Also, a gift of \$10.00 in memory of Roger Benitz was received. Through the year so far thirty-one members have made gifts to this fund, ranging in size from \$5.00 to \$100.00.

Given assets of this fund are now \$346,009.74. Dividend and interest income this year is \$15,598.30. This has been used for the ministries above. There is an envelope for this fund in the front of your packet.

I just read this quote today. "For-profit companies grow to deliver results to investors. But great non-profits gain to expand and develop their mission." This is what our endowment funds are about.

Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Lutheran Church,

Let's Celebrate! If there ever there's a time to celebrate, it is now! In December we remember God's great love for the world in the birth of Jesus Christ, God's only Son.

Jesus came into the world "that whoever believes in Him might not perish, but have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him" (John 3:16-17). That's something to celebrate.

Still, celebrations started even before Christ was born.

When Mary was told she would be the mother of Jesus, she celebrated and said: "My soul magnifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God, my Savior" (Luke 1:46-47).

The celebration continued at His birth. An angel appeared and brought the

message: "Behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:10-11). Then a heavenly hosts joined the angel and sang: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom He is pleased" (Luke 2:14).

The shepherds celebrated when they responded to the angel's message and went and saw Jesus, their Savior. As they returned to their sheep, glorifying and praising God, they shared this Good News with others (Luke 2:18, 20).

The Wise Men celebrated when they found the Christ-Child and presented to Him very precious gifts (Matthew 2:1-11).

So, with Jesus' birth, there were many celebrations. Still today, all who know Jesus as Savior and Lord continue this celebration.

How do we celebrate?

• By remembering why He came. 1Timothy 1:15— "The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost."

- By rejoicing in who He is. Colossians 2:9—For in Him [Christ] the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily.
- By praising Him for bearing our sins on the cross, paying the penalty of death. 2Corinthians 5:12—"God made Him [Jesus] who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God."
- By glorifying Him for rising again in victory on the third day. 1Corinthians 15:3-6—"For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures,

and that He appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then He appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep."

• By worshiping Him who right now reigns at the right hand of God and

intercedes for us before His Father. Hebrews 1:3—"He [Jesus] is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of His nature... After making purification for sins, He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high."

• By receiving His on-going ministry here on earth. Luke 24:46-48— "[Jesus] said to them, 'Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in His name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things.'" Luke 10:16— "The one who hears you hears Me."

Believers celebrate with the angels who sang: "Glory to God in the highest." They celebrate like the shepherds did who saw the Baby, recognized Him as the promised Messiah, and spread the Word concerning Him. They celebrate by worshiping Him who is the Christ-Child, who came into the world to save sinners from eternal death— in God's house with fellow believers.

Health Topic December 2022

Wait For the Lord by Annette Toft Langdon RN, BSN, MA (Re-printed from Evangelical Lutheran Parish Nurse Association, ELPNA.org, with permission)

Wait. Look both ways before you cross the street. Wait. The clerk will get to you soon. Wait. Your test results will be come in a few days. What, wait? Who likes to wait? It often raises anxiety. We like to keep moving, to get things done or resolved and to be tended to now. And then comes Advent, a time of waiting, anticipation and preparation. It seems a bit ironic that as the days get shorter and the darkness deepens, we tend to get busier and there is no room for waiting. Waiting is not easy. It is counter-culture... and it is a posture of the heart that yields an abundance of blessings... if we wait. As you move toward the holidays, here are a few thoughts on ways to wait, to prepare your heart, to make room in your being for Jesus, for more love. • Set aside 5 minutes to pause, quiet the mind, still the body and open your heart...letting peace, joy, love, whatever may come, settle in your being. • Take 5 minutes to focus your heart on one verse or a small portion of scripture. Perhaps taking a psalm or the story of Jesus's birth (Luke 1:26-2:20) and reading just a bit every day. What word stands out, speaks to you, makes you wonder or want to ponder? • Before or during an activity, like baking or decorating the tree, pause to ponder what this activity means to you. What memories does it hold? What gift is wrapped in it? • Carry awareness into the day. Where do you find anxiety, worry, vexation? What might need to shift in your life, your heart, in order to invite in peace and love? • Pause to sing a prayer. Perhaps an Advent hymn or song or make one up from what is stirring in your heart. May your heart be blessed with blessings borne of waiting, of comfort and joy as you prepare and celebrate the Love that comes down to us on Christmas.

I hope you enjoy this brief article as much I did. I feel it contains very good advice as we enter the busy season of Thanksgiving and Christmas.
